



Poster Guidelines

1. Poster Size

• **Standard Dimensions:** Standing banner version poster size 70 cm x 130 cm (width x height)

2. General Layout

- Orientation: The poster can be designed in either portrait (vertical).
- Layout of poster content: The poster should be proportionally divided into the following sections:
 - Introduction (20-25% of the poster's height)
 - Methods (25-30% of the poster's height)
 - o **Results** (30-35% of the poster's height)
 - o **Conclusion** (15-20% of the poster's height)

3. Details of Each Content Section:

a. Introduction

- **Position**: Place at the top of the poster.
- **Content:** Provide the background of the research and objectives.
- **Text Size:** Use a large font size that is easy to read from 1-2 meters away. Typically, 28-32 pt for the main text and 36-40 pt for the title.

b. Methods

- Position: Place below the Introduction section.
- **Content:** Detail the research methods, including study design, sample, instruments used, and procedures followed.
- Visuals: Include diagrams, workflows, or images to support the explanation of methods.
- **Text Size:** Use a slightly smaller font than the Introduction, around 24-28 pt.

c. Results

- Position: Place below or next to the Methods section.
- **Content:** Present the research findings clearly using tables, graphs, or images.
- Visuals: Utilize graphs that are easy to interpret, with contrasting colors to make the results stand out.
- Text Size: Similar to Methods, use 24-28 pt. Ensure that each graph or table has a clear title and caption.

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d. Conclusion

- **Position:** Place at the bottom or side of the poster, below the Results section.
- **Content:** Summarize the key findings of your research, along with implications or recommendations for future research.
- **Text Size:** Use a font size similar to the Introduction, around 28-32 pt, to draw attention to this section.

4. Visual Design

- Background Color: Choose a simple and professional color such as white, light gray, or soft blue.
- **Contrast**: Ensure there is good contrast between the text and background to enhance readability.
- Margins: Leave a minimum margin of 2-3 cm on all sides of the poster to provide space and prevent content from being cut off.
- Logos: Include institutional or sponsor logos at the top or bottom of the poster.

5. Additional Tips

- Readability: Make sure the text can be easily read from at least 1 meter away.
- **Clean Layout:** Avoid overcrowding any section. Use spacing effectively to separate sections and make the poster easier to follow.
- **Simplicity**: Keep the content clear and concise. Avoid using over<mark>ly l</mark>ong text blocks.

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
